Many of us spend a lot of time focused on our physical health. We are on different diets or looking for new ways to reach our target weights. We go to the gym or exercise in other ways. ## Torah Parashiyot (and Writings)

Upcoming Parashiyot and some of the many topics to consider:

**March 31** – No Torah study. Happy First Day of Passover

**April 7 – 10:30am**- Passover 8th day is the traditional Torah portion. However, let's focus on the 613 mitzvot.

**April 14 – 9:30am- Shemini (Leviticus 9:1-11:47)**- What are rituals for the priests? What are rituals for the people? How do they reflect modern day? Why does it matter what we eat? What are our responsibilities with food today? What is Or Chadash doing to participate in this Torah portion?

**April 21 – 9:30am- Tazria/Metzora (Leviticus 12:1-15:33)**- Why is this considered the “worst” Torah portion in all of Torah (is there such a thing?!) What are the rituals after someone has a baby? Why are skin diseases part of Torah?

**April 28 – 8:30am- Acharei Mot- Kedoshim (Leviticus 16:1-20:27)**- Why the change of clothes for Aaron? What does it mean for us? What does moral uncleanness mean? How do we reconcile that idea in today's world of political correctness? Are there abominations in Judaism today? What does holiness mean?

**May 5 – 10:30am- Emor (Leviticus 21:1-24:23)**- Does God want perfection? Are exemptions from service a support or an embarrassment to a person? Do we shame God? What is your favorite Torah holiday and why? How have we held to the Torah principles and how have we shifted?

**May 12 – 8:30am- Bechar-Bechukotai (Leviticus 25:1- 27:34)**- What would happen if people were to be treated like land? Does the Torah actually want socialism? What does it mean to have practical love of a neighbor? Does God bargain with us?

**May 19 – 9:30am- Bemidbar (Numbers 1:1-4:20)**- We often skim the names at the beginning of this portion. But, if we look at the names, what do they represent about Israelite society? What are the additional responsibilities of a first-born? What happens in actuality? Is it good to be noticed by God?

**May 26 – 9:30am- Naso (Numbers 4:21- 7:89)**- What is the system for caring for the Tabernacle and does it work? Why are there such concerns for ritual purity? What are the three primary categories of impurity and what does it mean for the care of the Tabernacle? What was the precursor to divorce and how did it evolve?


**June 2 – 8:30am- Beha'alotecha (Numbers 8:1-12:16)**- What does the symbol of the menorah mean? What is the second Passover? How does Moses' connection to his father-in-law model a relationship for us with our family? Does experiencing God first hand actually change one's behavior toward God and God's wishes?

But, I also want to challenge you to look at your different health “stools” and evaluate the time that you spend on physical, mental, and spiritual health. Rebalance yourself. Don’t tell me you don’t have time. I am as busy as you are. Make time. Make it a priority. Go to services, rest on Shabbat, go to Torah study or Talmud class, or engage in meaningful silent prayer. Whatever it may be for you. But, look at your health stool and make sure each leg is sturdy. When your stool is more stable, you will feel even stronger. Pirkei Avot (Ethics of our Sages) reminds us that “the day is short but the reward is great.” Make your day great- it’s time to rebalance!

## Religious School Committee Update

All year long, our students have been collecting money for various charities. Some of the organizations the money will go to include Temple Beth Shalom of Puerto Rico, MAZON: A Jewish Response to Hunger, American Red Cross, CHAI (Concern for Helping Animals in Israel), Friends of the Israeli Defense Forces, and Make-A-Wish Foundation. Each grade set a tzedakah goal at the beginning of the school year. In the hallway of our temple’s classroom wing, charts on the wall show the progress our students have made in reaching their goals. Our students are doing great! Thank you, students and families!

With the snow day on February 4, Religious School will finish on Sunday, May 13. That means that COLOR WARS are coming! Plus, there is still time to earn some end of the year awards:

- Shabbat Service Attendance – attending 10 or more services over the course of the year
- Hebrew Achievement – Pre-K/K - 3rd grade students who master 5 of the prayers that they were expected to learn, and 4th grade and higher students who master 10 of the prayers that they were expected to learn (mastery of a prayer is determined by the Rabbi)
- Pirkei Avot Portion of the Week – submitting at least 10 sets of answers to the Rabbi’s weekly questions over the course of the year. In addition, each class in which 75% of the class over a semester thoughtfully (i.e., the answers must show some effort from the students) completes weekly Pirkei Avot portion sheets will earn a party. So, if a class has ten students, then,

over a ten-week semester, at least 75 of the 100 sheets in that semester must be thoughtfully completed.

- Jewish Reading – reading at least 10 Jewish books over the course of the year

And every month, students can be recognized for being a mensch.

You can be a mensch by joining the Religious School Committee! Our next meetings in temple will be on **April 29** at 12:15pm and **June 3** at 11:00am.

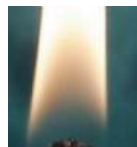
# Oneg Calendar
