Everyone is welcome to read the material in advance or just come without any prereading. Either way, all are welcome. Come as your schedule allows. But, the more you come, the more you'll make it part of your regular routine and the more you'll get out of it. ©

Saturday, May 6 – 9:30am Torah Study *Emor (Leviticus 21:1-24:23)* What are additional laws about holiness? What do we do with sacred food or blemished animals? What are our sacred times as Jews? When can we retaliate? What happens to blasphemers?

Saturday, May 13 – 9:30am Torah Study Behar-Bechukotai (Leviticus 25:1-27:34) Why is resting the land important? What happens if we do not listen to God? How do we even "the playing field" in today's society? What is our final reminder in this portion and how does it impact our connection to Or Chadash? What is our reward if we listen to God? Does threatening someone work?

Saturday, May 20 – 9:30am Torah Study *Bemidbar (Numbers 1:1-4:20)* Who and why do we count in the tribes? Where do the different tribes live? How are the priests organized and how does that impact our lives today? What are the prices of redemption?

Saturday, May 20 – 11:00am Talmud

Saturday, May 27 – 10:00am. There is no Torah Study, but please join us at Shabbat Services and the Bar Mitzvah of Zack Chidakel

Saturday, June 3 – 9:30am Torah Study Naso (Numbers 4:21-7:89) Is there an age at which people should be mandated to retire? If you are more aware of God, does that make you more holy? Are there different levels of holiness? Why is a fast linked to spiritual progress or it turns into a "sin"? How do we justify the importance of the priestly benediction in today's Judaism?


